Dear Friends,

I would like to acknowledge Frank Lundy's longtime participation in AIDS Walk Philly and thank you the Congregation of First Presbyterian Church of Germantown for supporting his efforts through your donations. Unfortunately, our records only go back to the 2000 AIDS Walk Philly, but over just the past 25 years, Mr. Lundy has raised over \$24,000 through his hard work and the generosity of his friends at First Presbyterian! We know he was participating before 2000 the amount raised is actually even higher!

The focus of AIDS Fund's programs is to achieve the goal of "Getting to Zero" - zero stigma, zero infections, and zero deaths. Our public awareness and education efforts are designed to combat the stigmas associated with HIV, and to increase awareness about the newest prevention strategies and the advances in the care and treatment of HIV.


Our From All Walks of Life Fund supports people living with HIV through financial assistance grants during times of crisis. Thanks to donors like you, AIDS Fund provides emergency assistance grants to people living with HIV disease, 75% of whom live below the Federal Poverty Level. These recipients have included:

- *a teenage immigrant who escaped abuse in their home country and needed a translator for an asylum hearing;*
- *a person who desperately needed safe housing to escape a domestic violence situation;*
- *a person whose water heater broke in winter, leaving them without hot water;*
- *a family that needed to move due to unsafe black mold in their home.*

Mr. Lundy's efforts and your support help to ensure that the most vulnerable members of our community have the basic necessities that can assist them in maintaining their health and keep them in care.

Mr. Lundy has certainly made a difference in the community and the generosity of the congregation is greatly appreciated. I hope you will continue to support Mr. Lundy's and AIDS Fund. You have truly made a difference in the lives of people living with HIV disease in our community.

Reflections on Advent


